

Certificate in Basic Palliative Care for Registered Nurses. The Palliative Care Centre for Excellence in Research and Education (PaIC) is offering a seven-day course, which aims to develop participants' theoretical and practical knowledge in delivering competent, evidence-informed holistic palliative care in any healthcare setting.

Course Objectives

1. Understand the principles and overview of palliative care services in Singapore
2. Identify psychosocial, emotional and spiritual issues in palliative care
3. Articulate the role of Advance Care Planning
4. Identify ethical issues in palliative care
5. Demonstrate effective communication skills in palliative care
6. Understand role of palliative rehabilitation
7. Recognise the importance of caregiver support, grief and bereavement issues
8. Able to manage pain and common symptoms in end of life care
9. Recognise and manage patients at the end of life
10. Understand the goals and care in palliative wound management


Training Methodology

This course involves Interactive lectures, case sharing, role play demonstration, experiential role play, and large and small group discussions. There will also be a written assessment component in the form of MCQs and submission of a reflective essay.

- Art therapy and music therapy in palliative care
- Management of pain and common symptoms
- Wound management in Palliative Care
- Care of the dying in their last hours
