She obtained her license to practise as Palliative Care Nurse Practitioner in New York State, and was accredited by US National Board for Certification of Hospice & Palliative Nurses to practise as an Advanced Certified Hospice & Palliative Nurse (2006-2010).

Sylvia is currently an Advanced Practice Nurse (Palliative Care) with the Home Care and Programme Dignity team (integrated palliative home care services) at Dover Park Hospice.
