For patients who are at the end-of-life and their families, it is important for healthcare professionals to apply ethical principles to provide care that is patients' best interest. Pertinent to care in the ICU settings, this course will cover topics of medical futility, mental capacity assessment, the authority of the family in decision-making, decision-making tools (LPA, AMD, and ACP), and care of foreign workers and the vulnerable.

COURSE OBJECTIVES

In this course, participants will engage in discussions based on case vignettes commonly found in hospital settings, particularly in ICUs, for patients who are facing life-limiting illnesses. By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Recognize fundamental ethical principles involved in the care of patients facing life-limiting illnesses in ICU settings
- Explain the prevalent ethical dilemmas encountered
- Apply appropriate tools to analyze the ethical challenges commonly faced

Health professionals, including doctors, registered nurses, advanced practice nurses, psychosocial staff, allied health professionals, and senior management, who care for patients at the end of life, particularly patients in an ICU setting.

TRAINING METHODOLOGY

A flipped classroom approach would be used, with team-based learning involving case discussions, and virtual large and small group discussions, as well as didactic lectures.
