Course Objectives

2. Comfort-focused and holistic care approaches
3. Basic symptom assessment and supportive care
4. Basic nursing care and pressure injury prevention
5. Changes in end-of-life care and escalation needs
6. Self-care in palliative care practice
7. Grief and Bereavement work

You will learn at your own pace through e-learning and tutorial sessions conducted online and onsite which reinforce understanding and application.

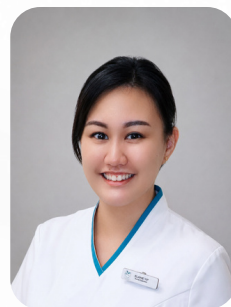
Lead Trainers' Profile
